Dear CRJW Friends,

This year our Annual Report shares a message of hope. Reading about the work of the Center For Restorative Justice Works (CRJW) in 2022, you will see that we have turned a corner. Children and families with a parent in prison have encountered many hardships during the pandemic: delayed visits, continuous shutdowns, and the anguish of not knowing about the health and well-being of incarcerated loved ones. The situation looked brighter at the end of the year -- we successfully launched our first-ever Get On The Bus (GOTB) virtual event in Los Angeles which provides a support center for video visits, and GOTB hosted in-person events at Salinas Valley State Prison and California Men's Colony in San Luis Obispo, reuniting approximately 300 children and caregivers with incarcerated parents. Casting an eye toward the year ahead, we anticipate a full year of programming for GOTB. We look forward to those moments of joy and tenderness that come from bringing children and their parents together after a long separation.

CRJW has always been, and remains, a grassroots organization whose programs are powered by volunteers from all over California. Support comes from our partners who share safe spaces for events and make breakfasts and treats for traveling families, and from our staff who work tirelessly to bring our programs to life. And of course, GOTB child-parent visits are not possible without the support of donors like you whose generosity is the bedrock of our financial sustainability. The fact that CRJW's community of supporters has nurtured its mission for over twenty years is testament to the universal importance of what we do: reunite families. We invite you to read the stories and reflections in this year's Annual Report, authored by the children, families, volunteers and staff who participated in CRJW programs last year. We thank each of you for your continued support. Your compassion and concern for children and families separated by incarceration remain our greatest hope.

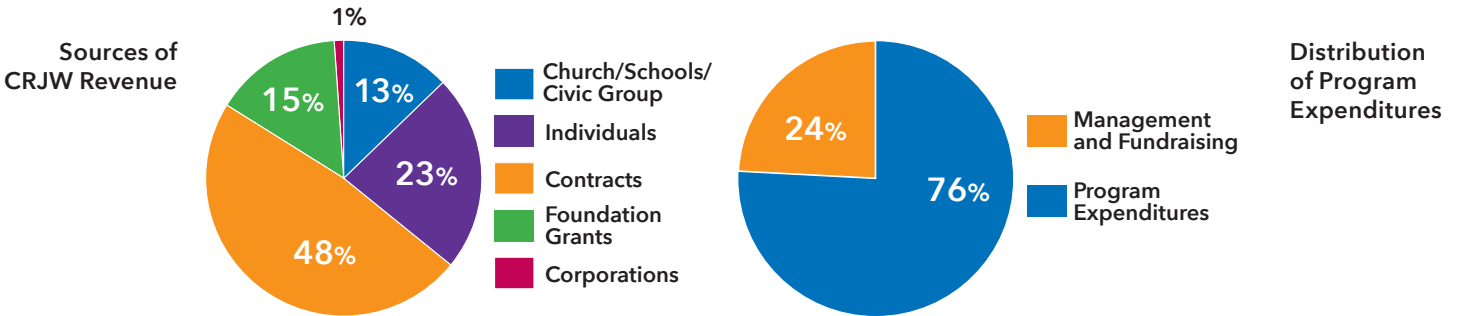

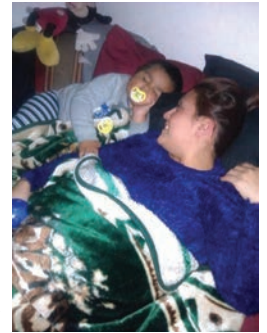

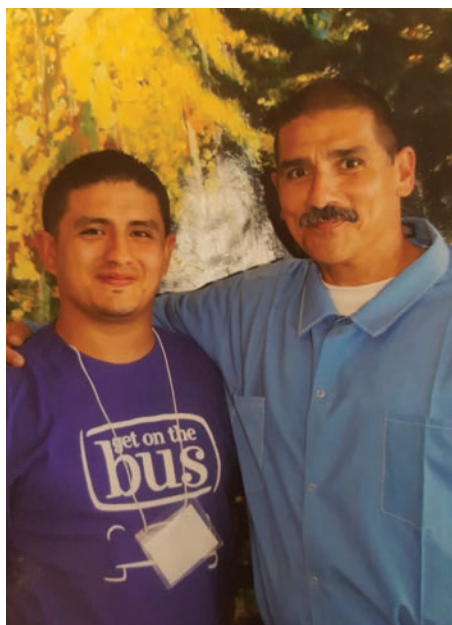


Get On The Bus



Get On The Bus (GOTB) is a transformational program that provides free transportation during Mother's Day and Father's Day for children to visit a parent at California state prisons. Since 2001, GOTB has served over 15,000 children. GOTB is committed to building stronger families and stronger communities. In 2022, GOTB began hosting in-person visits again for the first time since the start of the Covid-19 pandemic.

Victor shares his experience with GOTB



My father has been incarcerated since I was one-year old. Since I made poor decisions in life as a teenager and young adult, I followed in my father's footsteps and was convicted of a felony even before I knew the consequences.

As an adult, learning to forgive my dad for his absence in my life, I wanted to meet him and introduce him to my wife and daughters. But because I had been convicted of a felony, I lost the privilege of being able to visit him. Then I heard about CRJW and their work to reunite children with their incarcerated parents. I did not hesitate to seize the opportunity.

Because of CJRW's efforts, not only was I approved to visit my dad and finally meet him, but my wife and kids were also approved. We were able to have a full-contact visit, which means we had the privilege and honor of sitting down with him at a table and eating with him. We shared laughs and hugs. He held my baby daughter, the first time since holding me as a baby twenty years ago.

When I felt I was up against all odds, CRJW supported me and reminded me to never give up. I was reunited with my father after 20+ years. Huge shout out to this organization for changing lives and paving the road for the impossible to be possible. Thank you!

Get On The Bus Virtual Events

The Get On The Bus (GOTB) 2022 season experienced some prison shutdowns due to Covid-19 protocols. GOTB worked to keep families connected during shutdowns through video visits, using the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) video visiting system to offer GOTB Virtual Events. Much like our GOTB in-person events, these GOTB Virtual Events were unique and special for the children and their incarcerated parents.

During GOTB Virtual Events, incarcerated parents video-conferenced from prison visiting rooms with their children and families at the GOTB Hub in Los Angeles. We are grateful to our partners at Stella Academy, and St. Bernadette Parish in South Los Angeles, for providing a safe space to host these virtual events. Participating families had access to a private classroom and their visits lasted much longer than regular video visits. Our staff and volunteers were thrilled to hear laughter fill the halls of the GOTB Hub, as families reconnected and even played games like Pictionary and Family Feud.

Families and their incarcerated parents received a hot meal while visiting, creating a special shared meal experience. After video visits, children received handwritten letters and a photo from their parent, as well as backpacks and a teddy bear. We also provided each child with a stay-connected kit, which they were able to use to write and decorate special messages for their parents.





CrossOver, also called Women of Wisdom (WOW), provides monthly support services at the California Institution for Women in Chino. This volunteer-driven program invites community members to cross into the world of prisons and to foster transformed understanding between the outside community and those experiencing incarceration. CrossOver restores community relationships and creates awareness about the real impacts of the criminal justice system.

Dorinda CrossOver/WOW Volunteer, shares her experience of the program

In March of 2022, Women of Wisdom found ourselves shaking off the fog of COVID, moving from darkness to light and joining together. We were sisters longing to embrace and share our wisdom once again.

We returned to find the blessing that half our sisters had sojourned on, and to find women who longed to experience kinship and sisterhood once again. We returned to share the wisdom of loss, grief, pride, courage, hope and joy. We returned to music and song. We returned to laughter, games, and celebration. We were in darkness and now we are women bathed in light. We know there will be hiccups and lockdowns, but we know we have each other and we hold each other in our hearts.
