


Financial Stewardship





The Center for Restorative Justice Works raises funds to support programs through a grassroots network of generous donors. Each donation adds a compassionate voice to our movement to keep families together when a parent is in prison. We are grateful to each contributor and to the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation for joining us in this mission. We are also proud that CRJW's commitment to transparency and responsible financial stewardship has been recognized with a **100%** rating on Charity Navigator and a Guidestar Platinum Seal of Transparency.

During the 2019/2020 Fiscal Year, CRJW raised \$524,692. The sources and use of funds are detailed below.

Keeping Families Connected During the Pandemic

The Covid-19 pandemic has created heartbreaking challenges for children of incarcerated parents. With your support, CRJW's work to keep families connected has risen to meet the moment with Stay Connected Projects!

Stay Connected provides personalized postcards, family video messages, and Stay Connected kits with postage, stationery, and envelopes at no cost so that families can maintain consistent contact while visits at prisons are postponed. Stay Connected has been a lifeline for children and families who have not been able to see each other for many months and are concerned about the health and safety of their loved ones.

This program would not be possible without the support of the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation and California Correctional Health Care Services. Working together, we launched an innovative program that lets video messages be exchanged between families and incarcerated loved ones.

Family Express

Family Express provides free transportation and family reunification services to children and families across California on a weekly basis. By offering safe and reliable transportation to visit a parent or loved one in prison, Family Express offers the opportunity to restore and build those precious family relationships that mean so much to us all.

Ryan shares what Family Express means to him and his family

Thank you, Family Express, for helping me and my dad visit my mom. I only get to see her once a week, but I look forward to it all week. My dad is unable to take me because it's too far and we have no other way to get there besides the Family Express bus. All my other friends get to see their mom every day after school and I wish I could see my mom after school too. I have to wait all week to tell her about everything that happened, but whenever we go I never get to finish. Time goes by so fast.

I haven't seen my mom since March because of the virus, and I don't know the next time I will see her. I do get to talk to her, but it's only once a month. I'll be happy when Family Express can take me and my dad back to see my mom. It's fun to

ride the bus to see my mom. I have met new friends and we get to play games on the ride there. Before the virus, the best part of my week was visiting my mom. I always look forward to it.

Get On The Bus

For nearly twenty years, Get On The Bus has been reconnecting families and building stronger communities by reuniting daughters and sons with their incarcerated mothers and fathers on Mother's and Father's Day each year.

Get On The Bus has been a transformative experience for Rosie and her family

ur loved one has been incarcerated for over twenty-four years. About seven years ago my two boys and I started getting on the bus. We knew GOTB was a good program and we had heard so much about it. Our first experience was through a really big church. They went all out – it was just so nice! It's a good experience for younger kids, especially ones who don't get to see their loved ones very often. They get to enjoy a different side of their dads through Get On The Bus. They get to eat pizza together, which makes everyone happy, and it takes us out of the typical visit. GOTB visits give families a lot more freedom and allow for a more intimate visit than would otherwise be possible. Every year it has been a pleasure for them. Now we take my grandson, who is four, and he just loves it. "We're going on the big bus!" he says.

The staff are great people, and I hold them dear to my heart. GOTB has been there to support the kids and our family through this journey. I am already a volunteer with GOTB, and my husband looks forward to becoming a volunteer when he gets home so that we can offer the same support we have received to other GOTB families.



My husband was granted parole this year. After 24 years he will be out! We just can't wait for him to come home. He's ready to come back into society and be the best he can be. Even with these tough times right now, it's going to be a happy ever after ending for us. Thank you GOTB, I appreciate everything you do!


Staying Connected

Letter writing is an essential way for children to connect with their incarcerated parents, not only as a method of communication, but also as something to hold onto and cherish.

See what exchanging letters with mom has meant for A.J.

My auntie told me about the Stay Connected program, and I wanted to hear about how me and my mom could stay in contact. She calls every week and I can send her letters in an email, and I write letters and send drawings to her. When I get letters from my mom, I fill up with happiness because I know that she wrote to me, and I run to my room and read them. She sends me some really cool things, like science. She sends me some *National Geographic* stuff that I enjoy reading. And she enjoys reading my letters, too!!! When she calls, we talk about all the stuff we sent each other. Also, she sends me the certificates she gets when she finishes a class or a job. I keep them safe

in a binder. I am so proud of my mom because she's taking classes to make better choices. I have a treasure box for all the letters she

Camp Suzanne provides a rare opportunity for a child to spend quality time with a mother in prison. The camp program is a combination of art and family support, offering a platform to renew and nurture the critical relationship of mother and child. Camp Suzanne is a chance for children to heal and reconnect with their incarcerated mothers in safe and caring spaces.

During this week-long summer program, children spend mornings and afternoons with their mothers on prison grounds, engaging in fun activities like dancing, creating art, games, and having a movie night with mom.

"Camp Suzanne made us even closer than we were and I just feel we have an unbreakable bond."

Transition4Success provides employment and training opportunities for formerly incarcerated individuals at the Center for Restorative Justice Works headquarters. Our mission is to support positive post-prison outcomes for returned citizens by helping them adjust back into society with a sense of self-worth and dignity. Transition4Success participants bring meaningful insights and ideas, which help us continually improve CRJW programs to meet the needs of children and families.

Life Lessons Learned Through the Humility of Others

Tdidn't know that my work at CRJW would unite families, give birth to hope, give flight to dreams, and teach me so very much about life. Transition-4Success instilled in me a confidence and sense of purpose that continues to serve as a driving force in my life today. I evolved a strong work ethic, learned computer skills and programs, and gained a profound appreciation for the selfless contributions of staff and a vast network of volunteers. More importantly, the unwavering support of the entire CRJW staff provided a key element in my successful transition back into society... humility.

I am currently employed in the field of social work and mental health services. I continue to pursue my goal of earning a BA in Psychology. I am active in the movement for social justice and prison reform. I've worked hard to maintain a productive transition and to reciprocate the positivity I have been gifted throughout my journey. In looking back at those very first steps I took upon parole, I can't imagine where I would be today without the skills, support, and life lessons I gained through my association with The Center for Restorative Justice Works and Transition4Success.

CrossOver, also called Women Of Wisdom (WOW), provides monthly support services at the California Institution for Women. This volunteer-driven program invites community members to cross into the world of prisons and to foster transformed understanding between the outside community and those experiencing incarceration. CrossOver restores community relationships and creates awareness about the real impacts of the criminal justice system.

Volunteers from the community cross over prison walls monthly to be in compassionate conversation with our sisters inside, offering emotional support and advocacy before the Board of Parole Hearings. The number of inside attendees as well as volunteers has grown over the years. We now have 24 community volunteers and average 40 attendees a month.

Well, that was the case before the Covid-19 shutdown mid-March 2020. We miss our sisters terribly and don't see an end to this separation for many months to come. We had such great plans already in place for 2020: sharings and group discussions led by volunteers and inside leaders on vulnerability, restorative justice, parenting, shame, and domestic violence; and performances by the Los Angeles Street Symphony, which were to be open to the Yard.

In the interim, as we wait to be reunited with

our sisters inside, we have organized hundreds of books to be delivered to



CIW for continued education and sharing. As Women Of Wisdom we know that great healing can be realized through compassionate friendship and acceptance of whom we have evolved into being right here and now. We look forward to reestablishing our sisterhood soon, God willing.
